Calendar Description

This course provides students with practical knowledge along with theory necessary to provide the services in manicures, pedicures, waxing and lash/brow/tinting.

Rationale

This is a required course for Esthetician students. This course is designed to provide students with practical application. Students are expected to meet specific criteria required for each service: manicures, pedicures, waxing and lash/brow tinting and to learn proper interaction while building good rapport with their clients. Students will also be able to identify parts of the nail and common nail and foot disorders/diseases.

11. demonstrate being flexible, accommodating and willing to overcome difficulties with self, co-workers and clients.
