Draping, Shampooing & Treatments

Calendar Description

This course provides an overview of the draping, shampooing methods and treatments used in the care, styling and treatment of all hair types.

Rationale

This is a required course for the Hairstyling program. Students must develop an understanding of client care and how to ensure they are draped appropriately to protect the client. Particular focus is on the correct use of various hair products and treatments to clean client's hair prior to cutting or styling, as well as understand the use of various products that promote healthy hair development, and demonstrate correct hair washing/conditioning.

1. The correct procedures in performing a proper hair treatment.
2. The proper formulations and method to correct hair problems.
3. The effects of conditioners and treatments on hair.
4. The application procedures for the different types of conditioners.

Section E: Scalp Treatments

1. The purpose and steps involved in giving scalp treatments.
2. The purpose and proper procedure in recognizing scalp conditions.
3. Brushing of hair and application of creams.
4. Scalp treatment manipulations.



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
